Peter Cole is an Indigenous scholar in the Department of Curriculum and Pedagogy. He has published in many national and international literary and academic journals and books and is the author of *Coyote and Raven go Canoeing: Coming Home to the Village* (McGill-Queen's University Press, 2006). His approach to writing reclaims cultural space through poetic storytelling voices that makes orality the foundation of scholarship. This session of Coyote's Keyboard will be an informal discussion with Peter about the opportunities and challenges of speaking on paper. As Dr. Cole puts it,

writing stories —it's a challenge to do oral writing  
but if you speak aloud and transcribe it you have  
an inkling of speaking on paper or pixels is your  
writing meant for a listening audience even  
listening readers

how does one transcribe tone rhythm atmosphere  
gesture bodymindheartspirit and how might  
pause silence and beat fit in
